correct determination.

The female identified as Anotogaster basalis Sel. is in fact a somewhat atypical teneral specimen of A. nipalensis Sel.

Gynacantha bayadera Sel. — a male was taken at Biritante (970 m) near Pokhara on 4.XII.

Anax indicus Lieft. — specimens were found in both V and 1X at several localities between 700 and 900 m in the Pokhara region and also in the eastern Terai at Taraha (200 m).
