The editors are pleased to publish this special ABN issue on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the Royal Botanical Society of The Netherlands. Evolution has been one of the most challenging concepts since the middle of the last century. The jubilee symposium of the Society on 'Plant and Evolution', which was held at Nijmegen on 18 May 1995, was a good opportunity to evaluate the state of the art in a historical perspective. For that purpose, highly reputed scientists were invited by the Board of the Society. It describes and comments upon the long history of the Society in a fascinating way. The celebration was further highlighted by awarding medals of honorary membership to Professor A. Quispel and Dr A. M. C. Emons.

The colour plate on the front cover was kindly placed at our disposal by Professor S. C. H. Barrett, one of the invited authors. It is a picture of a mass flowering clone of *Eichhornia crassipes* in Louisiana, USA.

The reader will certainly enjoy travelling through the contents of this jubilee issue.
