BIBLIOGRAPHY OF DOCTOR MIKE WRIGHT

Abstract — A portrait and the complete bibliography (1937-1959) of M. Wright (1914-1953) are presented along with a few personal notes. Most of his work is devoted to the North American Odonata.

Introductory Note

Doctor Mike Wright was known to me only through his letters and accounts of his friends. It was from him that I learned of his excessive weight and occasional ludicrous situations because of it—some comical and some not so funny. I still chuckle over a snapshot of him in a comic pose that he sent me illustrating "The esthetic way to collect dragonflies". To Dr.

KORMONDY's "In Memoriam, Mike Wright, 1914-1953", I would add that he had a marvelous sense of humor. To his biography which gave only a brief summary of the scope of Dr. Wright's interest in taxonomy and ecology, I would also like to add his biblio graphy. Of his 29 papers, 25 deal with the Odonata. He described the nymphs of three species and wrote eight other articles concerning dragonfly nymphs. One was a key to the genera of Anisoptera of the United States and Canada. Another key to genera, published posthumously with Mike Wright as junior author, included the Zygoptera as well. The following list includes all of his papers known

to me.
