MACRODIPLAX CORA (BR.) NEW FOR LOMBOK, INDONESIA (ANISOPTERA: LIBELLULIDAE)

On 18 July 1991, during a visit to Lombok, I took photographs of a male and a female of this species. The locality is a brackish water pond at a palm tree beach, 2 km N of Senggigi beach. Both individuals roosted on the tip of stalks at a height of at least 2 m. From time to time they started for a short feeding flight. At the same site also *Tramea eurybia eurybia* Selys was on wings. Near Sendang Gile, in the northern part of Lombok, at the foot of Mt Rinjani near Sayang, I observed on 20 July also *Orthetrum glaucum* (Br.) and *Euphaea lara lombockensis* McL.

M.A. LIEFTINCK (1953, Verh. naturf. Ges. Basel 64: 118-228) listed 28 species from Lombok. Five supplementary species were added by J. BELLE (1994, Notul. odonatol. 4: 60-62). Since M. cora is not listed here, my record is considered the first one from Lombok, from which island 34 odonate species are now known. M. cora has a tropical distribution and is widespread on islands in the Indian and the Pacific Ocean (B.F. BELYSCHEW, 1968, Dt. ent. Z. (N.F.) 15(1/3): 9--13).
